

PRIVACY INFORMATION NOTICE

Children's Health Scotland is committed to safeguarding any personal information you give us. When you do give us personal information we will make sure to meet our obligations to keep it safe under the Data Protection Act 1998 and the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). This privacy notice explains how we use information collected from members of our **Family Participation Group**.

The personal information we hold, why and what we do with it

We collect, store and use your name, address, email address and phone number. The basis for processing this information is that it is in your and our legitimate interests that we do so. You have also given us your consent to do so. This means that we can provide you with information about participation opportunities, our updates and news mailings.

If you sign up to receive our news mailing we will use your email address to send it. We won't send you this unless you agree one can be sent. We may use Mailchimp to send our mailing and they will need your name and email address. Mailchimp complies with the EU-US Privacy Shield Framework. Read their privacy policy http://mailchimp.com/legal/privacy/ By subscribing to our news mailing you agree to us sharing your name and email address with Mailchimp.

If you sign up to our newsletter via our website, send a query or email any of our staff via our website your contact details will be stored a UK based secure server managed by the Graphics Coop. Read their privacy policy on https://graphics.coop/privacy-information-notice/

We also may hold sensitive personal information, if you agreed to give us this, about the health or medical condition of your child. This comes under the special category of health and social care. This helps us to provide you with participation opportunities or information of particular interest.

We may also process special category information (health, race, sexual orientation, religion/belief, refugee/asylum seeker status) collected if you fill in our equalities monitoring form. This information is anonymised and is used to help us monitor equality of access in our service. You don't have to provide this. The legal basis for us processing this is consent: special category: research and statistics.

We will only use your details for the purposes specified above. Tell us if any of your details change so we can keep our records up to date.

How we store your information

Any information you provide will be kept confidentially and securely. Only those in our organisation who need to contact you or provide you with information will have access.

Who personal data will be shared with

We will only share information with other third parties/service providers where it is necessary for a legitimate reason to help us to provide you with our services (eg mailchimp). We won't do so unless we check with you first, or unless the law requires us to do so.

Your legal rights in relation to personal data

Privacy Information Family Participation Members

Under the GDPR you have certain rights about the information we hold about you. You have the right to be informed about your personal information; to request access to your information; to ask us to correct it if it is wrong; to ask for it to be erased where it is no longer necessary for the purpose for which it was collected; to restrict its use. You can object to the use of it where the processing is based on consent. You have the right to data portability (to be given back your data in a structured format or for us to give it to someone you choose); and rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling.

How long we keep information

We will keep your information for as long as you are a member of our Family Participation Group. We will check from time to time that you still want to be a member. If you do not want to then we will then remove your details from our records securely and confidentially. You can however ask us to remove your information at any time before this by emailing enquiries@childrenshealthscotland.org

If you are on our news mailing list, we may check from time to time that you still want the mailing. However you can ask us to remove your name from our news mailing list at any time by selecting unsubscribe when you receive the mailing, or by emailing us on enquiries@childrenshealthscotland.org

Other

We do not make decisions about the use of your personal information using automated processes. You don't have to provide us with your personal data as part of a statutory or contractual requirement or obligation.
